A primary school gives the children and parents an amazing opportunity, to have seven years together. This enables us to work in partnership and really get to know you and your children. Each phase is distinct and different but works as part of the whole. The children have an increase in responsibility as they move up the school and are really clear about routines and expectations. It enables smooth transitions between the classes and years and the children to have strong role models.

If you join us at Year 3, clear communication with your Infant School enables your child to start with us following a visit to their current school. We spend a long time getting to know your children at their current school, through transition days and when they start with us.




