This year Reigate Parish became a primary school and as such for the first time we competed competitively in sports against other schools in our district. When we commenced the academic year in September we knew that we were embarking on unknown territory for the first time, but we always felt confident that our pupils and staff would work very hard to achieve personal bests. What an incredible year we have had in our first year of KS2 Sport.

Competitive Sport

In year 3 and 4 there are three competitions open to these year groups: Cross Country, Gymnastics and District Athletics. I am very pleased to announce that our pupils were very successful in all of these events. In Cross Country despite not having any year 4s on our team our year 3 girls finished in 3rd place. In the year 3/4 Gymnastics competition our year 3s came 4th place, and just recently our year 3 students finished 1st or 2nd in almost every single event at the District Athletics.





Non-Competitive Sports Offered

This academic year at Reigate Parish we also offered non-competitive clubs such as running club, dodgeball and football, which were open to all students of all abilities to participate in. We were the only school to host 5-a-side football friendly for both girls and boys of this age.

Dance

This Year the year 3 pupils were part of "A CLASS ACT" – Schools Theatre Arts Project. A professional dance instructor came into the school, choreographed and taught our pupils a routine. Our Pupils then went on to perform at the Harlequin in front of a full audience.



Swimming

In year 3 children do swimming lessons once a week in the summer term as part of our curriculum. Two external swimming teachers come into the school and that teach our pupils. Swimming lessons take place at Reigate Grammar School.

Sports Week

All students at Reigate Parish Church Primary School also participate in an annual Sports Week. In Sports Week students partake in a sport workshop, some house competitions, and competitive running and throwing events. Sports Week finishes with Sports Day, where family and friends are invited to come and watch their children compete in various activities.



Looking to the Future

Next academic year, 2017-2018, we will enter all the above competitions and also begin to develop our Netball, Football, Quickstick (hockey), Cricket and other sports programs in preparation for the 2018-2019 academic year. When our pupils are in year 5 and 6 these sports (netball, football, Quickstick and cricket) become open for them to compete in and we will be ready to enter these competitions.
