

## Use and Impact of the PE Sports Premium at Reigate Parish Church Primary School for academic year 2016-2017

Reigate Parish Church School was allocated in 2016-2017 a sum of £8,600. The table below provides a summary of how the PE Sports Premium fund was allocated and the impact it has on raising the standards in PE and improving teachers' skills in teaching PE.

Focus	What impact has been?	PE & Sports Fund
PE specialist	<p>We employ a part time PE specialist teacher who has re-written the school's PE scheme of work, leads PE sessions with the teachers and has organised external competitions for our pupils to enter. She has organised to host events at our school.</p> <p>Teachers have talked about their increased confidence to deliver PE in an effective manner because they have observed our specialist PE teachers teacher. In turn, student's attainment and enjoyment levels have increased, as seen by our internal tracking data.</p> <p>Once a week the PE specialist sets up varied activities and games during lunchtime. This has increased children's opportunities to try new games and be physically active during play time.</p>	£7,639
Equipment	Old/damaged equipment has been replaced with new equipment. New equipment includes goalposts, dodgeballs, tennis balls, netballs and team vests.	£484.17
Medals /stickers	Medals were ordered for sports day to reward children who were placed in the top three in each sporting event. All students received a participation sticker.	£65.60
RRPSSA membership	Our PE specialist teacher attends the local PE network meetings (RRPSSA) and through this we have accessed local tournament, festivals and competitions. We also set up friendly football year 3 matches through this network meeting.	£40.00 £447.30
Pedal Power Smoothies	Pedal Power Smoothies showed our children the effort it takes to make a healthy smoothie.	£107.00
KS1 multiskills	All our Year 2 children attend one of three local KS1 multiskills events – this develops their sportsmanship qualities, working as a team and visiting different places in the local area.	
Dance show participation	Year 1 children had coaching and joined in a local dance show	£465.00
