

## Use and Impact of the PE Sports Premium at Reigate Parish Church Primary School for academic year 2017-2018

Reigate Parish Church School was allocated in 2017-2018 a sum of £7,371.00 (five months funding, received in April 2018) and £10,319.40 to be funded later (7 months funding). The table below provides a summary of how the PE Sports Premium fund was allocated and the impact it has on raising the standards in PE and improving teachers' skills in teaching PE.
